Dear Friends of GSIG!

I was first directed by my sponsor to get involved with Seattle Intergroup in 2005. I was pretty confident I could be of great service to Seattle Intergroup. I was there to make myself available to serve as 3rd Legacy Chair.

Like all of my other plans that I have constructed out of delusion and ego, it was easily swept away by a loving higher power at the first board meeting I attended. In addition to the guy who been active in Corrections for over forty years, there were two former Delegates, three former DCMs and four people who announced birthdays of over twenty years. Needless to say, they didn't need me to tell them anything, so I listened. I served and I listened. My service continued with additional rotations as Special Events Chair and Vice Chairman. I was elected to Chairman of the Board for 2012 and 2013.

Up to that point I had been in attendance for six years of board meetings. Very little out of the ordinary happened, hardly anything had changed. The only thing that had changed, was that things were smaller. Things like attendance at board meetings, contributions made by the groups, new members showing up to serve. All those things had been gradually getting smaller.

The first year of the rotation brought the blessing of a literature controversy. That helped boost attendance and interest. We ultimately decided not to sell the literature, but all of the discussion had primed us for a long overdue inventory.

Much was said, a report was produced. For me, the inventory allowed me to digest some big chunks about myself and how I could serve more effectively. It became apparent that Intergroup wasn't about me, the staff, the other volunteers, or even the fellowship. It was about the alcoholic who hadn't been born yet. That if the trends at Intergroup didn't change, that it wasn't going to be there to serve that alcoholic.

That changed the way I served. It made many of the questions that were being asked very easy to answer, even if the solution was uncomfortable to face. I attempted to serve the way my higher power would have me keeping in my mind that alcoholic who hadn't born yet.

The second year of my rotation as Chair was filled with a tremendous change. Many of the longstanding folks who had served for years decided to serve elsewhere. We were fortunate that influx of new members was far greater than those moving on.

Two years later as we prepare for another rotation, that trend has continued. All of the standing committees are healthy and active in carrying our message. The board is fortunate to have a full slate of qualified candidates to continue the work of aiding the groups of the greater Seattle area in carrying their message.

It has been my pleasure and inspiration to be part of GSIG and serve with all of you.

Transition plan: GSIG- assigned email client has been managed with folders and contacts and will be turned over to in-coming Secretary. Provided in-coming Secretary with all files used during term. Provided Office with thumb drive of all files used during term. Provided transition memorandum to in-coming Secretary. Met with in-coming Secretary to de-brief. Attendance/participation statistics for 2014-15 term: Total active zones: 11 (55.0%); average number of zones attending: 10 (48.3% of total; 87.9% of active); average zone attendance rate (active): 76.7% of meetings; average zone attendance rate (all): 51.5% of meetings. Total active officers: 5; average officer attendance (88.3%). Total active committee chairs: 14; average committee chair attendance: 74.1%. Detailed view of attendance/participation statistics for 2014-15 term is available upon request. Productivity statistics for 2014-15 term: Average attendance: 25; total meeting time: 43.9 hrs.; average meeting length: 1.9 hrs.; total attendee time: 1,110.7 hrs.; average attendee time/meeting: 47.9 hrs./meeting; total non- administrative motions disposed of: 12; average non- administrative motions disposed of: 0.5/meeting.

Review of past meeting minutes

Minutes from the November 2015 meeting were distributed. It was **moved** (Zone 112) and **seconded** (Zone 131) to approve the September 2015 meeting minutes, as revised. **Motion adopted unanimously.**

Treasurer (Chris W.): "November financials indicated a strong Group Contribution, with Total Contributions at \$10,300, of \$1,300 over budget. Retail Sales were down by \$5,273. Cost of Goods Sold (COGS) were down by \$4,118, which is good. Gross Profit was over budget by \$81. Total Expenses were down by \$1,215 from the budget. This left the Net Income at negative \$1,451, when we budgeted for a \$2,749 loss. For the year, through November, Total Contributions at \$110,882, exceeded budget by \$1,182. Total Retail Sales, \$125,154, remained under budget by \$33,145. COGS, at \$83,410, was down \$30,429, which is good. (If it isn't selling, don't keep it in inventory). This left our Gross Profit under budget by \$570. Expenses show Total Paid staff under budget by \$8,915. Total Expenses, \$166,406, were down \$9,992 from the budget. All this left the Net Income at a negative \$7,906. We had budgeted to lose \$17,509 by the end of November. Committee Earmarked funds have \$8,518 unspent. So, where do these figures leave us? At \$94,932, our cash reserves are below 2014 numbers by \$2,000. Attention to inventory, purchasing, and payroll have kept Intergroup in fairly good shape. With Literature Sales down 19.9% in 2015, it will be interesting to see how the groups respond to the need in 2016." -*Written report submitted 12/15/2015* It was **moved** (Zone 116) and **seconded** (Zone 115) to accept the Treasurer report. **Motion adopted unanimously.**

Zone 112 (Thomas F.): Held 30th annual Gratitude potluck.

Zone 114 (Larry B.): Freida for Larry; "Fifteen (15) attended last meeting. The last meeting was a holiday potluck at Tibbets Church in West Seattle. Business was limited to a poll of the attending GSRs as to how they would prefer to see the Intergroup budget presented. Fourteen (14) GSRs voted to have the budget presented showing the negative balance; thusly alerting the fellowship of help needed. Zero (0) GSRs voted to have a balanced budget presented showing a balance in the black. One (1) GSR abstained from the vote." -*Written report submitted 12/14/2015*

Zone 115 (Ian B.): Held gratitude banquet. Discussed 2016 GSIG budget proposal.

Zone 116 (Allison B.): "Six (6) attended last meeting. Sand Point Big Book (Sunday evening, Magnussen Park) reported that they WILL continue to have their meeting, and will continue to brainstorm ideas to get more involvement. Lake City Big Book has some new homegroup members. Members of the homegroup drive for Milam, and they have returns from Milam joining the homegroup. Women Coming Home is working on understanding and acting within the traditions. Reservoir Group found out that the church where they have their meeting DOES NOT allow dogs. District 16 posted a website: district16seattleaa.org. Travis came to give us a presentation about Third Legacy. The district has a goal for 2016 to have Intergroup committee members come to give us presentations about what they are doing. The district noted again that they believe that the budget should be realistic to historical data, and so they are in favor of the unbalanced budget. A member noted that they felt that the GSIG Intergroup committee has been *promoting* the blue buckets, rather than just providing them. This wasn't necessarily a complaint, just a not. Also, she said that she has seen blue buckets outside of the Seattle area. Again, not necessarily a complaint, but a note." -*Written report submitted 12/15/2015*

The start date has not been determined but it will start after the first of the year. More details to follow. It is the end of my rotation and it has been an honor to do my small part to provide an opportunity for the groups of Federal Way and Auburn to come together to share our experience, strength and hope. I encourage you to be of service beyond the meeting, making sure the voice of your group is heard. Thank you for this awesome opportunity. Zone 142 (Anne Marie M.): "Thirty-four (34) attended last meeting. Discussion about whether or not we want to send money to SnoKing. Lively discussion tabled until next meeting. Some groups based on past actions will not support donations to SnoKing. Others felt SnoKing is providing a service to the alcoholic in the area. AA supports service work. Another thread: whether it is a district obligation or individual group's obligation. Discussion about safety in AA. This was also tabled until next month to give members a chance to talk to their members of their meetings. Thoughtful words about bullying. Discussion about notification form for starting and ending meetings was tabled until we had more time. Fremont Group gave the intergroup rep a donation via a \$50.00 check." -*Written report submitted 12/15/2015*

Accessibility Committee (Janny B., Chair): Addressed "notes" presented by Zone 116. "The Accessibility Committee met on December 2nd at 6 PM at GSIG. Steve C. was our guest consultant and talked with us about the use of the Internet in reaching our target population. We discussed developing an interpreted meeting that could be held at GSIG and sent live to other locations on the Internet. We have a few servants who have been involved with the committee who have expressed interest in positions, but we still have lots of positions to fill. Hospitals & Treatment Committee (Jacob W., Chair): "Nine (9) members present at last meeting. Welcome to Abigail's Ghost participation. They are taking in a meeting to Cannon House. Thunderbird has 2 holiday meetings at 9 AM December 25 and January 1. Union Gospel Saturday meeting is good opportunity for men in the program to get a sponsee. Report from some facilities that there has been a problem with our volunteers' reliability. Possible for orientation session for all new volunteers and secretaries was needed. Also to include guidelines for appropriate action and speech. This committee has sent 2 12th Step calls into Harborview Hospital. Office Manager (Norm S.): **Report attached** -Written report submitted 12/15/2015

I am pleased and grateful to submit this Office Manager Report for November 2015.

Inventory—Inventory levels are considered adequate. The cover and internal proofs have been sent to Consolidated Press for the January 2016 schedule book. We expect delivery December 31 or the first week of January, and have again ordered 21,000 schedules. We have posted an announcement of the schedule price increase to \$0.75 on the website, to be effective 1/1/16. This was necessary because we will experience an increase of 33% over the July cost, which was unusually low because of the pink color error.

Process/Organization—

Office/phone weekday coverage: On Friday, December 11, we were happy to welcome back Tom O'B to his regular Friday afternoon slot. Welcome also to Dave R., new Thursday afternoon volunteer. So, with Tom's return, the volunteer staff is at full strength.

Weekday evening and weekend shifts: For group phone answering, weekend openings exist on the 1st Sunday, 6-10 p.m., on the 2nd Sunday, 2-6 p.m., and on the 3rd Sunday, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Please ask your groups to call Anita. The 3rd Thursday, 6 p.m. slot, open last month, has been filled by On the Waterfront.

Nightwatch shifts: When the December nightwatch calendar was published, there was one position on the 5th Thursday at 10 p.m. Please contact David d. for the most up-to-date information or to volunteer for this four-hour slot.

Physical Plant: The recent windstorm blew off the skylight in our small conference room. The landlord responded promptly with a recovery team, who covered the opening and dried out the room. A new skylight is on order and will be installed when received. We will schedule a carpet cleaning and tile waxing for late in the year or early January.

Financial Statements—Financial statements for November and November YTD are available for your review. Group contributions again nicely exceeded budget, but literature sales, again, failed to meet expectations. Gross profit, however, exceeded budget by \$80. All this yielded a loss for November of (\$1,500). For the 11 months year-to-date, the net loss of (\$7,900) compares favorably with the budgeted loss of (\$17,500), this resulting from office operating expenses, mainly personnel costs, which were less than budgeted amounts.

Personnel—The office committee has approved a cost of living increase for paid staff. The amount will be 1.2%, based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics CPI for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue metro area. I was honored to facilitate a group inventory on December 12, and now plan to be on vacation December 18-27. Our office will be closed on Christmas Day and on New Year's Day.

Finance Committee (Mike M., Chair): "Four (4) attended last meeting held via video conference. October 2015 GSIG Financials: The committee reviewed and discussed the November 2015 GSIG financial reports. We noted nothing significant or unusual in monthly activity and ending balances of the November financials and when compared to the prior month and budget both for the month and year to date. The November 2015 year to date actual net loss is only about \$8K as compared to the budgeted net loss of \$17.5K. This favorable trend continues to be due to lower staff costs of about \$1K. It was noted that November group contributions were about 18% or \$1.5K over budget, which is great and year to date group contributions were about 2.3% over the budget. This show of group support is much appreciated and significantly helps offset the decline in literature sales, which had a negative impact on the net loss of about \$2.7K. Other Committee Initiatives: none New Committee Member and Future Volunteers: Bruce E. will rotate off the committee in 2016, the December meeting was his last. We would like to thank Bruce for his service and contributions on the committee. The Committee will continue to seek and recruit new members. If you are interested in being of service please email the Finance Committee chair at financecomchair@seattleaa.org. Meetings are held monthly through a video conference so the only requirement besides willingness is a computer with a camera." -*Written report submitted 12/10/2015*

Web & Technology Committee (Leonard T., Chair): Website will be mobile-friendly later tonight (December 15).

Third Legacy Committee (Travis A., Chair): "Four (4) attended last meeting. Third Legacy has done 4 presentations since the last board meeting, including a District meeting (District 16). We are working on scheduling a presentation with District 14. We don't have any other presentations scheduled currently, and could
